# Introducing The Table Plaza

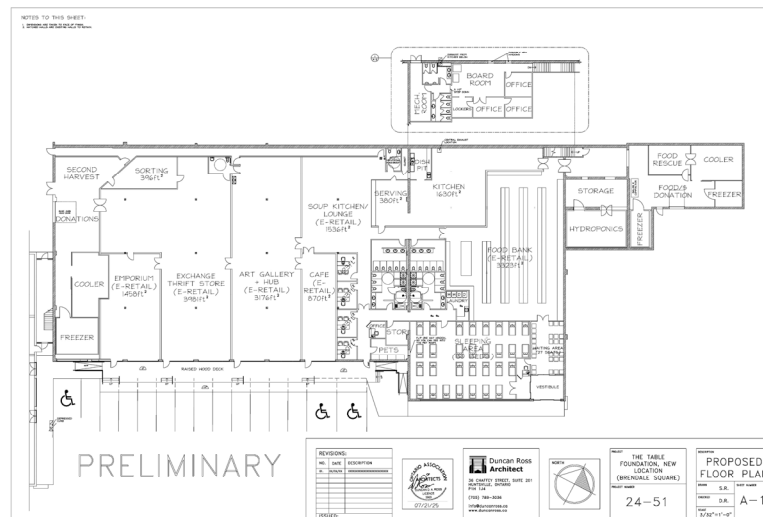
- A new, transformative, multi-purpose community hub at the former FreshCo site at 12 Cann St. in Huntsville

## Affordable Housing Vision

- Continuing at Hanes St.: Men's Hostel, Community Kitchen
- Plans to develop Hanes St.: affordable housing units
- Building at Plaza: Warming and Cooling Centre
- Opportunity to access 7000 sq ft downtown to develop into dorm style affordable housing

It's not just about giving people food today—it's about empowering individuals and families with the tools, resources, and support to build healthier futures.

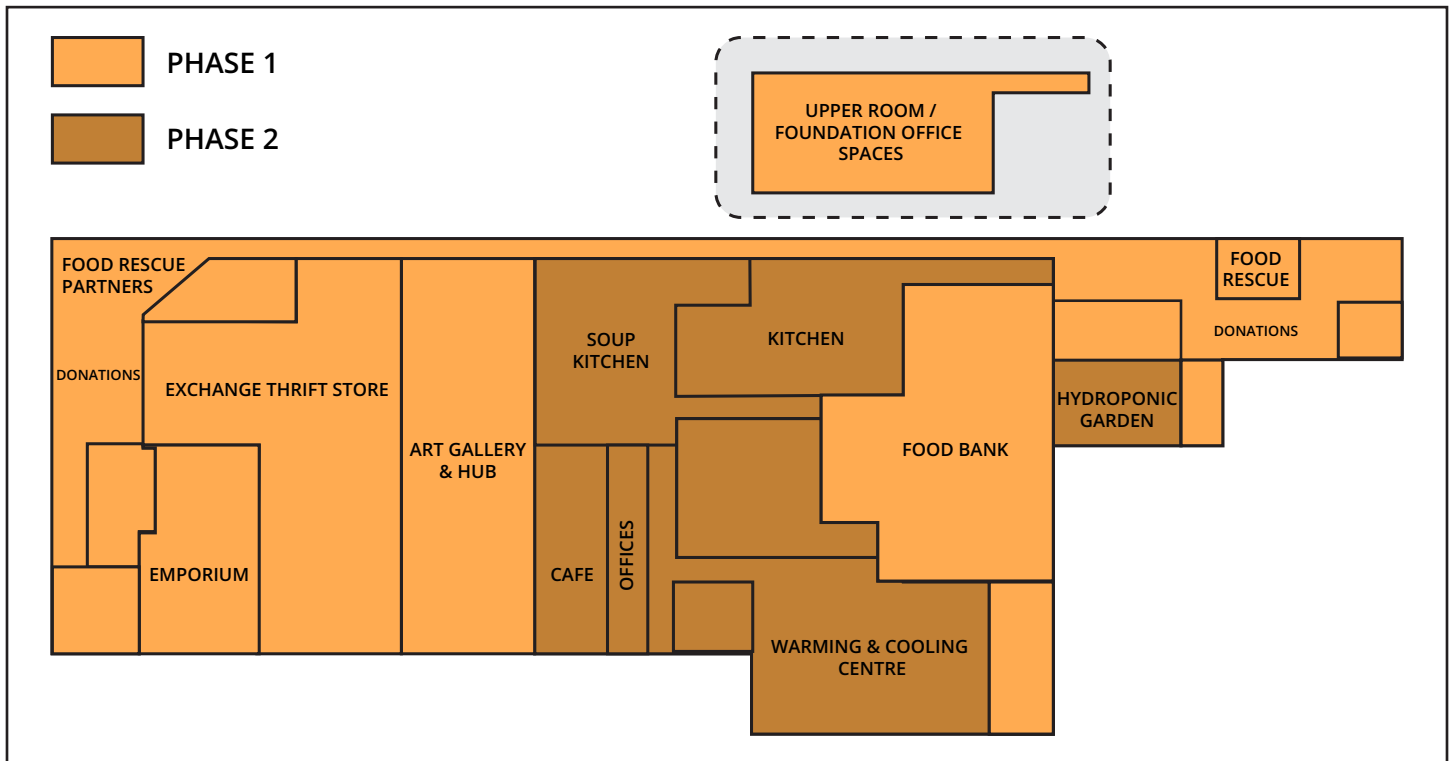

# PHASE 1

## FOOD BANK



The Table Food Bank will move to The Table Plaza from our 9 Hanes St. location and continue to offer our guests **weekly shopping opportunities**. Guests will be able to choose non-perishable or perishable food from our shelves, fridges and freezers. We aim to provide as many **healthy, fresh food options** as possible including dairy products, meat, bread and produce.

The improved location has an increased capacity to accommodate guests and provides a waiting area indoors. We welcome anyone to come, no questions asked, if they are hungry. **We treat our guests as family** and strive to offer love, grace, compassion and encouragement as they move along their journey.

## FOOD RESCUE



Our new space allows for a streamlined receiving process for Food Rescue donors, using the loading dock, to receive more food quickly and efficiently.

In winter months, this new system will make unloading food easier and safe for volunteers.

We will be able to efficiently receive, process, and cook the food within the same building, reducing travel time and improving volunteer satisfaction and service delivery.

A separate area for Food Rescue processing as well as an industrial kitchen for cooking will enable more volunteers to work at once and increase productivity.

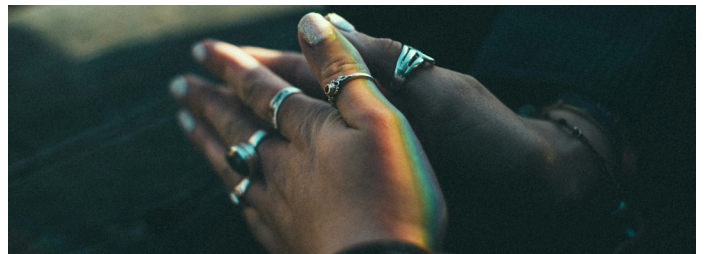
Increased walk-in coolers and freezers allows us to accept more donations and purchase food on sale.

The larger space provides **potential for further partnership** with Food Rescue organizations to redistribute rescued food to our guests who struggle with accessing our Food Bank as frequently as needed due to transportation issues.

Our Food Rescue ministry helps divert safe, edible good food from being wasted, thereby **addressing food insecurity, reducing food waste and mitigating environmental impact**.

Together, we will build a resilient future, enriched by collaboration and community spirit.

## UPPER ROOM



The mezzanine level, the Upper Room will house our Foundation **administrative offices** as well as deliverance prayer services, under The Table Love Connection ministry. As a Christian charity, we aim to treat all members of our community with Christ's love, and will continue to offer opportunities to those interested to learn, grow and develop deeper relationships with Jesus Christ. We are very excited about what God is going to do to bring people **freedom and healing**.

We believe it's important to not only provide physical food but also spiritual food; our deeper focus on prayer ministry will help facilitate that.

# PHASE 1

## EXCHANGE THRIFT STORE



The new space will be accessible to all **members of our community**. With more regular operating hours, we will offer free items to Food Bank guests and suggest affordable donations for items from all other shoppers. All donations will support our operations that serve those in need.

*The Table Exchange Thrift Store will welcome community members to donate and shop for items such as clothing, toys, books, games, housewares, linens, furniture, footwear and more. Donations will be received at the back entrance of The Table Plaza. We are also looking at opportunities for consignment items.*

## EMPORIUM



The word “Emporium” was chosen as it can encompass a variety of products and thus can morph as needed over the years.

The closure of Freshco in this plaza location meant there was no longer a grocery store in Huntsville’s downtown core. Many of our guests, as well as community members, had commented on the brevity of this in that food was far less accessible.

The Emporium will operate as an **affordable grocery store**, utilizing Food Rescued products as well as offering pre-made meals from our kitchen, fresh food baskets, and our Signature Product Line. Community members will donate as a way to support our services.

The Emporium will increase exposure to our services, meet needs like accessibility to affordable fresh food downtown, provide a location for local businesses to donate excess food that can meet needs of community members who might not attend our Food Bank, and provide us with an **opportunity to support operations** through donations in exchange for various items (anything goes in an Emporium!).

## PHASE 1

### ART GALLERY & HUB



Art has the power to transform lives. It gives meaning to our experiences, deepens our understanding of the world, and opens our hearts to new perspectives. Through art, we connect with our emotions, our inner selves, and our community. It fosters gratitude, joy, and self-awareness—improving our overall quality of life.

With this in mind, the Art Gallery and Hub at The Table Plaza will be a place of healing, creativity, and connection—

approached through a Christian lens and with ministry at its heart. It will offer guests and the broader community opportunities to enjoy and create art, while also helping raise funds for our essential services through suggested donations, events, and classes.

Our town lacks spaces for creative gathering. Similar to venues in other towns—where people paint, share tea or coffee, and celebrate special occasions—this space will meet a deep need.

The Art Gallery and Hub will not only welcome our Table guests but also draw more visitors and donors, enriching both lives and the community we serve.

### FOUNDATION OFFICE SPACES

We are creating a dedicated professional space to welcome donors, featuring an open layout in the Upper Room and a comfortable meeting area. We will now have a board room and office spaces to accommodate our growth.

We will accept both food and financial donations during regular business hours at a separate entrance where a visual display highlighting the impact of your historical donations will be created.

## PHASE 2

### SOUP KITCHEN



Currently we serve twice-weekly Soup Kitchen meals as sit down full course meals at Trinity United Church

on Mondays and St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church on Thursdays.

However, with the opportunity to provide a Warming and Cooling Centre for Muskokans, we will also serve meals for those utilizing the service and therefore we will amend how we operate.

With the ability to operate daily, we will offer Soup Kitchen meals and provide food for anyone in need.

We will prepare and cook the meals right on site, making food accessible every day and thereby meeting a broader range of needs within the community.

Our Warming and Cooling Centre guests will also enjoy breakfasts and bagged lunches, as well as access to our lounge area.

## PHASE 2

### HYDROPONIC GARDEN



We are re-purposing a cooler room to house a hydroponic garden, an extension of The Table Food Bank Garden (comprised of raised beds at our Hanes St. property and garden plots at the Huntsville Fairgrounds).

Hydroponics provides improved access to fresh, nutritious food by enabling year-round production, regardless of climate. This ensures a consistent supply of fresh greens for food-insecure guests and reduces reliance on processed foods, improving overall health.

By allowing the Food Bank to grow its own produce, hydroponics enhances food security and independence. It reduces dependence on donations and unstable supply chains while creating a sustainable, local food source—especially vital in under-served or urban areas. The system also offers educational opportunities by serving as a hands-on tool for schools, volunteers, and community groups. It teaches sustainable agriculture, nutrition, and food systems, helping participants build practical skills for home or professional use. Hydroponics creates volunteer and job training opportunities, engaging community members in planting, maintenance, and harvesting. It fosters civic pride and supports workforce development in the growing field of urban agriculture.

Through shared participation, the system promotes community well-being and connection. It brings together people of all ages and backgrounds, encouraging collaboration, ownership, and cross-cultural engagement.

Finally, the project demonstrates innovation and leadership, positioning the Food Bank and its partners as forward-thinking and committed to modern, sustainable solutions—strengthening the case for future funding and partnerships.

### WARMING & COOLING CENTRE



With nightly and holiday access our dedicated Warming and Cooling Centre will be available when community members need it the most, providing consistent relief. This Centre will cater specifically to those in need in Muskoka. Open beyond regular hours to support those in need during evenings, weekends, and holidays, it will have capacity to prepare and distribute Soup Kitchen meals every day, ensuring no one goes hungry. The Centre will provide shelter from extreme weather conditions, enhancing safety for the most vulnerable, as well as additional services (e.g., counseling, community gathering space) will be integrated, plus daily opportunities to volunteer. Our capacity will be for 30 individuals, with access to showers, washrooms, laundry facilities, beds, lounge area, wifi, Soup Kitchen suppers, breakfasts, bagged lunches, supports, and pet kennels.

*We served 10,563 Soup Kitchen meals in 2024, collaborating with local churches to feed community members in a warm welcoming environment. The Table Plaza will become home to daily Soup Kitchen meals.*

## PHASE 2

### CAFE



Years ago, the idea of The Table Café emerged as a way to support TTSKF's mission financially. By using our kitchen space, the Café will offer a welcome service featuring a delicious menu—providing a space for the community to gather while generating revenue to fund our free core ministries.

This vision builds on what we already have: access to fresh food, skilled volunteers, and a community need for connection and nourishment. We hope to eventually provide fair wage employment and foster inclusive dining, where sponsored meals allow everyone to eat together, regardless of income.

It's more than just coffee—it's a way to bring people in, serve all guests with dignity, and support lasting change.

## SUSTAINABILITY PLAN

The Table's Emporium, Exchange Thrift Store, Art Gallery & Hub, and Café are all ideas that have percolated over the years. They have been incorporated into the Plaza floor plan: as ways to generate revenue and thus assist TTSKF with sustaining our services, meet needs creatively, further community partnerships, provide a place where all members of the community can come together regardless of income level, benefit our community at large by adding value and options for enjoyment locally, bring donors to where our other ministry areas operate from so that you can see our ministries in action, benefit people's mental health as a whole, create job opportunities and training, offer fresh, healthy food for all, assist TTSKF in planning for future growth and needs by broadening our scope of service and thus capacity, all the while meeting the needs of our most vulnerable who are welcome to enjoy these same services.

### WHAT ABOUT YOUR CURRENT LOCATION?

- Still Active: 9, 11, and 13 Hanes St. will continue hosting The Table Men's Hostel and The Table Community Kitchen
- 9 Hanes St. is planned for conversion to dorm-style affordable housing (Phase 3)
- Furthering our desire to help create employment and training, The Table Work Crew will be developed with the support of our guests to meet this need

### WHAT IS THE COMMUNITY NEED & IMPACT?

- In 2024, 8.6% of Huntsville's population (21,147) used our Food Bank
- 74% of our Food Bank guests are from Huntsville; 26% from 38 nearby communities

### WHAT IS THE TIMELINE?

- Phase 1 renovations are underway
- Some services begin Fall 2025, with other services phased in as financial donations and support increases
